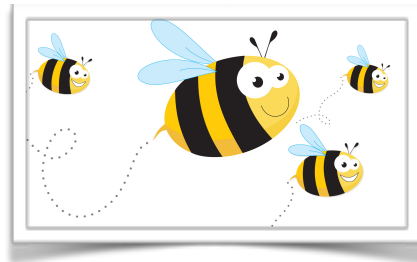
FUNDRAISING UPDATES!
